Do you want to know how to make sweatpants? Well if you do, then this article is great for you.

First: Start by measuring your waist, add a couple of inches then divide by 4, measure thighs, add a couple of inches, measure length of your legs, measure your cloth.

Secondly: cut out your measurements and for the crotch measure down your measurement and make a U shape, unfold and place the pieces with the U shape out right, sew.

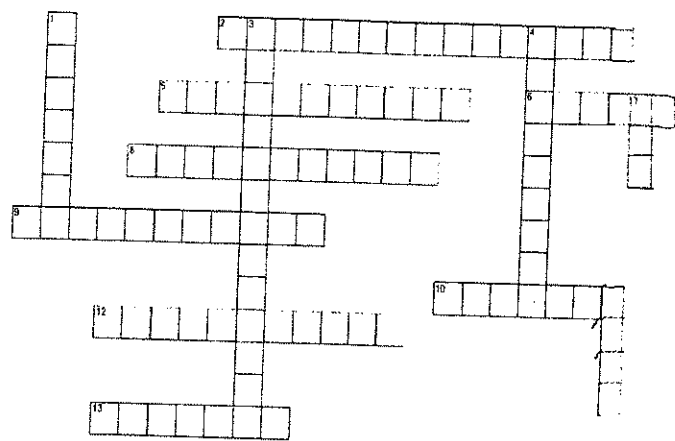

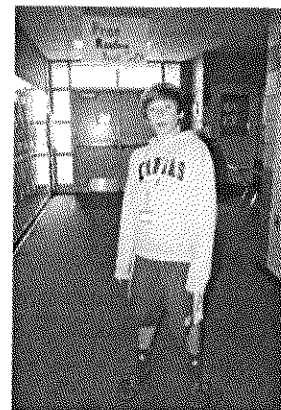

Underage Drinking

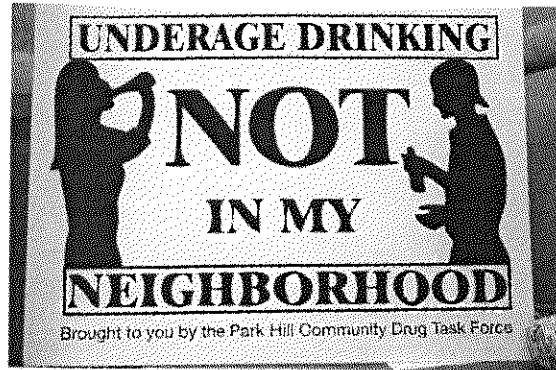
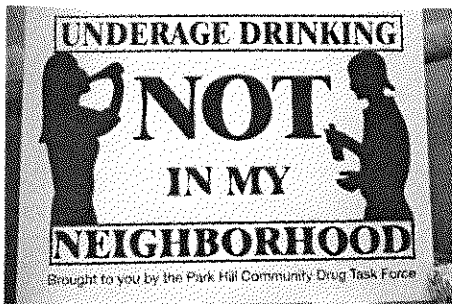

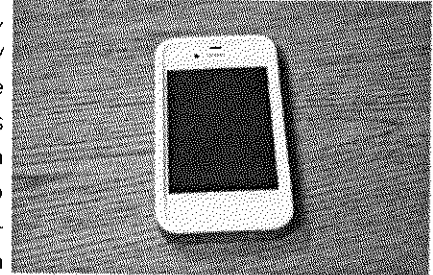

Joey Ferguson told me that," The iPhone 5 seems

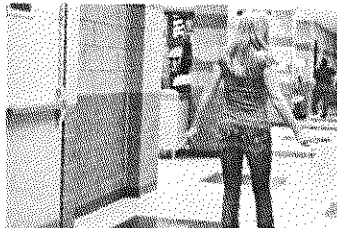

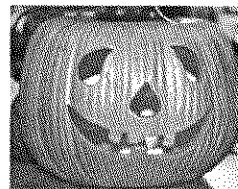
